FY2022 Collaborations

- * 444 soiled/damaged American flags collected. There was proper disposal of the flags.
- * Battery Recycling totaled nearly 30,000 lbs. at a cost of \$14,709.19 for the year.

- * Elgin Township TRIAD is made up of residents and local agency and service providers as a formal association. Its members vote officers in annually and community events are planned, promoted and carried out by its members and committees, since July 1998.
- * Township Community Rooms have been used by 5,467 residents in FY2022, representing 362 resident groups.
- * The Elgin Township building has been designated a west side branch of Senior Services Associates since July 2003 and has contracted with Elgin Township to perform 4 days a week programming for Seniors, Monday through Thursday.
- * In FY2022, 11,356 phone calls were received, and 1,605 persons were assisted in the office, averaging 1,080 persons assisted each month.
 - Expenditures for General Assistance in FY2022 were \$102,640.98 averaging 22 clients per month.
 - Expenditures for Emergency Assistance in FY2022 were \$33,337.57 averaging 6 families assisted each month.
- * Annually, Elgin Township files claims for reimbursements from the Illinois Department of Human Services for services provided while residents' applications are pending review with Supplemental Security Income Program administered by the Social Security Administration. In FY2022, \$810.00 was collected from the state, which totaled \$369,877 since the recovery program started in 1996.
