Economic Crisis Program: EC Financial and Case Managers provided the following to Elgin Township residents:

• 1,051 Elgin Township residents received 1,849 hours of service

• 16 Elgin Township households received \$17,394 in financial assistance for rent or utility

• 598 households received 10,694 meals from our Emergency Food Pantry

• 276 households received 17,012 diapers/wipes; 556 households received 23,005 toiletries; 164 households received 412 rolls of toilet paper

• 169 households received 320 all-day bus tickets valued at \$1,216; 18 households received transportation assistance valued at \$205 that included cab fare, Metra passes, and gas cards.

485 households received 964 food pantry referrals; 107 households received 127 clothing referrals; 44 households received 66 pairs of shoes or boots; and 32 clients received 55 blankets

• 34 households received 37 eyeglass referrals to the Elgin Lion's Club

• 106 households received 524 pairs of socks; 70 households received 303 under garments

• 29 households received 83 pairs of pants, 56 households received 166 shirts/sweatshirts, and 53 households received 78 items of other clothing or winter wear

EC Shelter: A total of 71 women were sheltered for 1,320 nights and 65 children for 1,363 nights; 25% (19 women for 467 nights and 15 children for 490 nights) listed an Elgin Township address. An additional 30 women for 718 nights and 17 children for 201 nights from Elgin Township were sheltered due to domestic violence.

Financial Report: 100% of the total grant has been spent through 9/30/19.
