Food for Greater Elgin received a grant from Elgin Township in December, 201 in order to establish a community resource center in order to deliver access to other organizations that would better the lives of people who were coming to FFGE for food. In the initial months one room was converted to a children's library and play room for use while parents were waiting assistance, a second room was designated as a community resource center and a number of organizations were recruited to provide programming to clients while they waite for their opportunity to shop. Amongst those groups were:

- AMITA St. Joseph Hospital, which provided a monthly well being check for guests (blood pressure and other medical services);
- ABLE, an organization that recruits seniors for continued participation in the labor market;
- · Oak Street Health Clinic, which limits its clients to medicare patients.
- VNA, Greater Elgin Family Care Center and the Well Child Center

Conversations were underway for the addition of programming by the US Census Bureau, Citizen's Utility Board and EPEL, an early childhood education support group.

And then the Coronavirus hit. In March, 2020 upon President Trump's address to the country reversing his earlier denials of the threat, overnight, the recruited partners withdrew their staff. Social distancing rules and the requirements of safe space required us to restrict the numbers of people entering our space. Children's space was itself quarantined due to the difficulties in sanitizing the space.

Food For Greater Elgin Midyear Report: Elgin Township Community Resources Grant

The vision is not gone, but we will be unable to utilize this program until the state of emergency is passed and we are able to relax restrictions on social distancing and partner agencies return to resourcing work outside of their own facilities. We have begun conversations with Centro de Informacion and the Community Crisis Center for their periodic participation. AMITA Health has assured us that they will return to offer shot clinics for both flu and, importantly, Covid-19 immunization when that becomes available.

Ultimately our fulfillment of the dreams funded by the grant will rely upon our receiving clearance to open community rooms and relaxing 'safe space' requirements and the willingness of our partners to return. I expect that this will happen in early to mid-fall, if all goes well.
