Dear Supervisor Ramirez,

Over the past several years, Elgin Township has helped fund a very valuable service to the clients served by a collaboration of Elgin Social Service Agencies. This collaboration includes PADS of Elgin, The Community Crisis Center, The Ecker Center, AID and the Kane County Mental Health Court. The previous grant has been a tremendous help in our efforts to supply adequate transportation to our clients. The funding provided by Elgin Township to support these programs has proven to be the most effective way to provide needed transportation services to the residents of Elgin Township and so we are requesting the renewal of funding of this grant for the upcoming year.

During this past year, funding from Elgin Township has been used to provide transportation through a number of ways including Pace Bus passes, cab vouchers, staff reimbursement for transportation expenses, and fuel and maintenance costs for owned vehicles. Through this program we have been able to provide our clients with transportation opportunities to destinations such as medical appointments, employment opportunities, appointments with Social Security or Department of Human Services, educational opportunities, transportation to mandated programs and many other locations relating to case management.

Being able to ensure that our clients reach these important appointments has been an integral part of our programs for many years and with the threat of state funding cuts, the need for your support is greater than ever. For that reason we request that Elgin Township renew funding in the amount of \$22,500. \$20,000 will be divided equally among the 4 human service agencies, and \$2,500.00 will be used to supply Mental Health Court client's transportation to much needed services.

If you concur that the request should be considered, please advise the date of the meeting on which the item will appear and I will see that an agency representative is in attendance and available to answer any questions or address any concerns.

Economic Crisis Program: The EC Financial and Case Managers provided the following to Elgin Township residents:

- 1,146 Elgin Township residents received 8,400 hours of service
- 27 Elgin Township households received \$32,980 in financial assistance for rent or utility
- 627 households received 10.912 meals from our Emergency Food Pantry
- 257 households received a November Holiday Food Box; 181 received a December Holiday Food Box
- 319 households received 25,664 diapers/wipes; 596 households received 26,198 toiletries; 246 households received 974 rolls of toilet paper
- 217 households received 556 all-day bus tickets
- 574 households received food pantry referrals; 175 households received clothing referrals; 59 households received 91 pairs of shoes or boots; and 50 clients received 105 blankets
- 26 households received eyeglass referrals to the Elgin Lion's Club
- 143 households received 888 pairs of socks; 31 households received 137 underwear garments
- 221 households received 613 coats, 227 households received 622 hats, 267 households received 842 pairs of gloves, and 160 households received 388 scarves

EC Shelter: A total of 45 women were sheltered for 679 nights and 44 children for 760 nights; 29% (15 women for 235 nights and 11 children for 181 nights) listed an Elgin Township address. An additional 36 women for 604 nights and 19 children for 455 nights from Elgin Township were sheltered due to domestic violence.

Financial Report: 71% of the total grant has been spent through 3/31/19 (\$39,016). This includes 68% of the cost of Personnel, 86.75% for EC Shelter, 100% for Facility Maintenance/Repair, and 94.2% for the Emergency Food Pantry.



### Ecker Center for Mental Health

#### **Elgin Township**

#### Six Month Report

The objective of the Psychiatry Services program is to provide excellent diagnostic and medication services that provide patients with optimal symptom control in order to facilitate their highest level of functioning. With Elgin Township's generous help, we are restoring our lost psychiatry service capability. We have eliminated the waitlist by reinstating new psychiatry hours. Currently there is only a brief wait time for initial psychiatry appointments. In the first six months of our grant period beginning October 1, 2018 through March 31, 2019 we have provided 1,137 Elgin Township residents with psychiatry services.

Currently, our Advanced Practice Nurse is completing her child/adolescent fellowship and will begin seeing adolescent psychiatry clients in the next month or so. In addition, she has agreed to work every other Saturday morning, from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. These additional Saturday hours, which began on March 2<sup>nd</sup>, will accommodate clients who have difficulty scheduling their appointments during the week.

In October 2018, the Psychiatry Services program began offering oral swab drug testing to help identify alcohol, illegal drug and over the counter medication misuse while taking prescribed psychotropic medications. The effectiveness of our mental health services and prescribed medications are optimal only when clients adhere to taking just their prescribed medications, limiting over-the-counter medication and alcohol use and abstaining from illegal drugs. If it's determined that these substances other than prescribed medications are in a client's system our qualified staff can quickly address the issue and offer help via providing education or referral to our substance abuse affiliates.

At the same time, we also began providing our psychiatry clients with the opportunity to receive a buccal swab lab test that can be used to evaluate the client's genetic makeup. Various genetic markers can help determine which psychotropic, anxiolytic and other medication types are best for each particular client. This testing allows our psychiatric providers the opportunity to evaluate medications the client has tried, what current medications are prescribed, and what medication changes, including dosing decisions may be best suited for successful outcomes.

We are very grateful for Elgin Township's continued and generous funding. Your funding helps us to carry on our mission of providing behavioral health services that help people with serious mental illnesses maintain their independence, health and highest quality of life.
