Funding Report Period: 6/1/20 – 8/31/20

- 26 children and 430 adults from Elgin Township received services across all Crisis Center programs
- 13 children from Elgin Township received 28.75 hours of Children's Program service; an additional 21 children from other areas received 89.50 hours of Children's Program service
- 3 women from Elgin Township received 12.75 hours of Children's Program service; an additional 6 adults from other areas received 12.5 hours of Children's Program service
- 3 children from Elgin Township spent 54 nights in our Shelter Program with their mothers and received 19.75 hours of service across all programs
- 11 women from Elgin Township spent 233 nights in our Shelter Program due to domestic violence or economic crisis and received 280.5 hours of service across all programs

Financial Report: 73% of the total grant has been spent 6/1/19 – 8/31/19; the remaining 27% will be spent on the purchase of portable desks and supplies to facilitate e-learning for Elgin Township children receiving services from our Children's Program.

Children's Program Support: \$4,961.46 or 66% for salary and fringes

Games and supplies: \$515.47 or 7%

COMMUNITY CRISIS CENTER, INC MISSION:

We provide Safety, Hope, Advocacy, Respite and Education for those impacted by crisis and violence in the Fox Valley Region and Illinois.

Due to the recent public health crisis our agency was unable to allocate the entire grant funds to the children's Program by 8/31/2020. 73% of the grant has been allocated. The remaining 27% will be used to purchase portable desks and supplies to facilitate Elgin Township children in our Shelter Program with e-learning.

As you know, the Governor of Illinois issued a shelter-in-place order March 20, 2020 in an effort to decrease the spread of the COVID-19 virus. The Crisis Center made the difficult decision to maintain only our 24-hour emergency shelter for women and children and the 24-hour crisis line. The shelter census was reduced to adhere to social distancing mandates. Walk-in services were temporarily suspended and a minimal staff of case managers and necessary employees were on-site; all employees who could were asked to work remotely. When it became evident that the shelter-in-place order would not be short lived off-site shelter in local motels was available for women and children and telephone and secure telehealth/video counseling was established for clients. Case managers and direct service staff, which include Children's Program staff, continued to provide services to clients in crisis.

Starting in mid-April direct service staff provided telephone and video telehealth counseling to children in shelter both on and off site as well as walk-in clients. Recreational activities were provided to children who were confined inside. Children in off-site shelter with their mother's received a bag of activities that were age appropriate. The bag included games, activity books, books, puzzles, and more. Our Children's Program staff have rearranged their program space and developed procedures for providing face-to-face services as we enter Phase 4 in June. The Children's Program has been working with area school districts to equip children in the Shelter Program with Chromebooks, Wi-Fi connections, school supplies and work space in their bedrooms for e-learning that started in late August.

It is important to understand that while the number of residents served is lower than estimated in our initial proposal we maintained 24-hour accessibility for shelter and counseling. Elgin Township Summer Programs for Youth at Risk funding assisted our agency in being available to Elgin Township residents during an unprecedented time and for this we are very appreciative.

It continues to be a challenge to allay the worries of some domestic violence victims who are reluctant and/or refuse to come into a shelter setting due to fears of COVID-19; even when it would be safer than the abuse they are experiencing. It is also a challenge to balance community need with directives from outside sources/funders, e.g. State of Illinois Restore Illinois Phase Program; IDHS; and Kane County Health Department.

We all have to rethink how we exist in the world with COVID-19. We understand that this time has been very confusing to children in general. Their regular routines of school, family visits and friends have been disrupted. Parents are under extreme stress, which may include increased instances of domestic violence, child abuse, job loss, possible homelessness, and or medical issues. As people start to adapt to this COVID-19 lifestyle we anticipate an increase in request for services that will include

counseling and emergency shelter. People needing emergency food, diapers and personal care items can call or come to the agency. Housing assistance is being provided by phone appointments.

Elgin Township Summer Programs for Youth at Risk funding supports the uninterrupted operation of our Children's Program that provides counseling to children and families in crisis. The mission of our Children's Program is *to provide a safe, nurturing environment where children are free to express feelings, play peacefully, learn non-violent behaviors and begin to understand the dynamics of domestic violence and other crises.* We know that a shelter-in-place order can create a dangerous scenario for many families and the children are vulnerable for increased trauma resulting in PTSD. It is essential to the health of our children that our Children's Program be able to provide services to both the children and their parents.
